Before You Start

A short guide to skill level, included files, project sizes and usage boundaries.

Skill Level

For silk painters with basic experience.

You should already understand how to use gutta / resist liner and how to apply colour on silk.

You should feel comfortable outlining a design, filling small areas with colour and working with simple colour blending.

What's Included

- Printable line-art design template
- Suggested square-format project sizes
- Personal use guidance

Not included:

Colour guidance, technique notes, painting order or video support.

Suggested Project Sizes

This square design can be adapted for:

- 55 x 55 cm silk scarf
- 45 x 45 cm cushion front
- 90 x 90 cm wall hanging or silk panel

You may scale the design up or down using the grid method.

Materials Note

This is a digital design template. Silk, dyes, brushes, gutta / resist liner and other painting materials are not included.

Please prepare suitable silk painting materials before you begin.

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Grid Transfer Method

Before the printable grid page

Create a full-size reusable paper pattern before working with gutta / resist liner.

How to Use the Grid Template

Make Your Reusable 1:1 Paper Pattern

Before You Print

This A4 grid template is a reference for enlarging the design. It is not intended to be used directly for gutta / resist outlining.

For a scarf, cushion front or larger silk panel, first create a full-size 1:1 paper pattern.

Method

- 1 Print the A4 grid template.
- 2 Draw a matching grid on a larger sheet of paper at your chosen final size.
- 3 Copy the design square by square using pencil.
- 4 Adjust, correct and refine the pencil lines before they become permanent.
- 5 Trace over the final pencil drawing with a waterproof acrylic marker or permanent black pen.
- 6 Place the finished 1:1 paper pattern underneath your stretched silk as your gutta / resist guide.

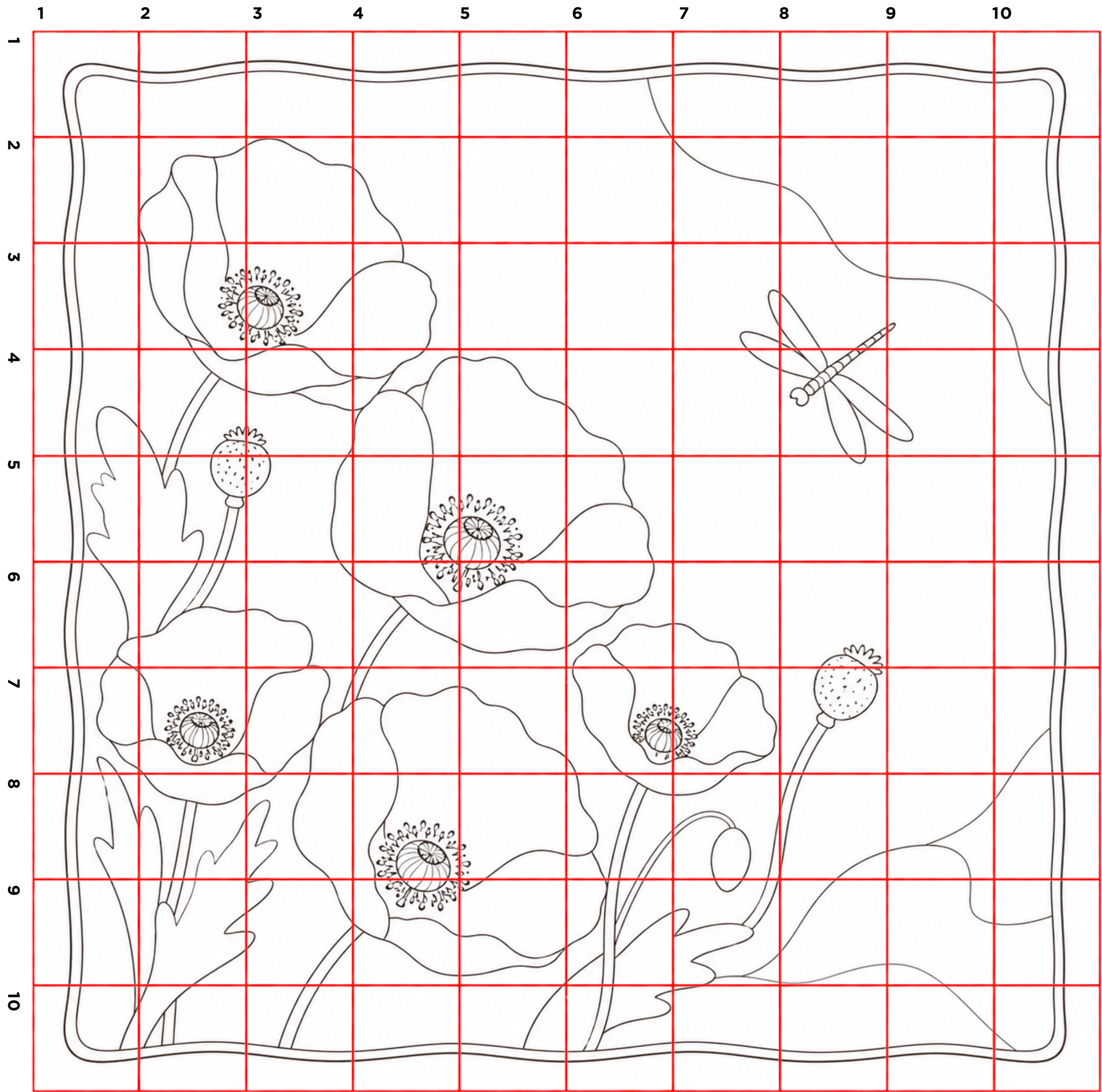
Why Make a Paper Pattern?

A reusable 1:1 paper pattern lets you correct the drawing before outlining. You can also use the same pattern again later if you want to paint this design with different colours.

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Clean Line-Art Reference

This clean version is provided as an optional reference.

For best results, beginners are advised to use the grid transfer method first and create a full-size 1:1 paper pattern before gutta / resist outlining.

Experienced silk painters may use this page as a clean visual reference for freehand transfer, tracing or digital scaling.
